



## Behavior Expectations

### Conduct

Conduct which interferes with the rights of other students to learn will not be tolerated and could result in removal from Summer School. Events surrounding the reason the student is sent to the office will be investigated and due process given. (No refunds)

### Smoking or Use of Tobacco

The use of all tobacco products (cigarettes, cigars, pipes and smokeless tobacco) and lookalike products, such as electronic cigarettes (E-cigarettes) is prohibited in or on all school district property (BOE Policy 1150). Any violation may result in dismissal from Summer School.

### Dress and Courtesies

The general atmosphere of a school must be conducive to learning. If a student's general appearance attracts undue attention to the extent that it becomes a disruptive factor, the student will be asked to make necessary changes.

**School ID will be required.**

### Cell Phones/Music Devices

Cell phone usage is prohibited during class (instructional) time. The use of music devices during class (instructional) time is at the discretion of the classroom teacher. **All USD 259 BOE Policies are in effect for Summer School. USD 259 is not responsible for damaged or stolen electronic devices brought to Summer School by students.**

### Learning Centers

The Learning Centers will be open at all comprehensive high schools during Summer School. Inquire at the individual schools for details.



## Attendance Policy

Students are expected to be present each day of summer school without exception. When students are unable to be present for the entire **12** days, **students risk removal from the summer school opportunity without credit and without refund.** Family vacations, doctor appointments, and other commitments **should not** be planned during summer school classes.

No make-up sessions will be held. Three (3) tardies equal one (1) absence. Any student late after 30 minutes to a session is considered absent. Students with one or more (1) **excused** absences may be withdrawn with an "F". Students with any **unexcused** absences may be withdrawn and no refunds will be given. *Emergency absences will be up to the discretion of the summer school administrator.*

- Course offerings and location are contingent on enrollment. Students will be notified by Friday, May 31, 2019 of any changes to their summer school schedule.

# Enrollment Information

## Enrollment Procedure

To enroll, students must see a counselor for course selection and completion of enrollment form before paying fees. Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment opens April 15, 2019. The last day to enroll for High School Summer courses is Tuesday, May 28, 2019, by 3pm. *After May 24th, you must go to North or Chester I. Lewis to enroll.*

## Course Fees

USD 259 Students: \$90.00 per class (one half unit of course credit).

All other Students: \$150.00 per class (one half unit of course credit)

- *No refund will be issued after student attends first session*
- *No transportation will be provided for Summer School*

# Course Offerings

The high school summer courses allow students to receive credit in required subject areas if they have previously failed a course.

Three classes are offered for original credit based on the following criteria:

1. Government, students entering their senior year (one semester course)
  2. Financial Literacy, students entering their junior or senior year (one semester course)
  3. P.E. Foundations, students entering their freshman year as well as all other high school students (two semester course)
- First semester courses (.5 credit) are offered in the morning session: 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.
  - Second semester courses (.5 credit) are offered in the afternoon session: 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.
  - The one-semester course in Government and Financial Literacy is offered through both sites, as enrollment and teacher availability allow.

**Summer School Offerings**

Wichita Virtual School will follow the same guidelines for enrollment as our partners at North High School. Our courses, however, are online, requiring all students to have high speed internet service and a computer at home to enroll. Students must have an active email address to maintain daily communication with their online teacher.

## Courses offered through Wichita Virtual School:

- Government (.5 credit) 3350\* (students entering their senior year)
- Financial Literacy (.5 credit) 7610\* (students entering their junior or senior year)

On Friday, May 31, **students must attend a face-to-face 1 hour orientation session.**

Orientation times on Friday, May 31 will be: 9 - 10:30 a.m. **OR** 11 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.
