Dress Code Policy

Parents and staff at Spaght believe that all students should dress in a manner that promotes a positive, safe, school climate that enhances self-image for students. Standardized dress has been seen to promote a positive effect on students, but only if everyone adheres to the policy. Please help us follow the dress code by monitoring what your child wears to school. The Spaght Staff believes that proper school dress is primarily the responsibility of the parents.

The Spaght standardized dress colors are **navy blue, light blue, white and orange.**

Approved Standardized Dress

Tops must be solid navy blue, light blue, white or orange

Polo or button down shirts with collars and sleeves

Sweaters or sweatshirts with a collared shirt underneath

Spaght logo T-shirts

Spaght logo sweatshirts can be worn every day with a collared shirt underneath

Insignia or logos are permitted, but may not be bigger than a thumb print

Sweaters/jackets without hoods may be worn in the classroom

Bottoms must be plain khaki or navy blue:

Shorts, slacks, skirts, jumpers, skorts, capris

Shorts may be worn under jumper or skirt

Tights Option: (under skirts, jumpers, shorts, skorts)

White, navy, orange, or black tights/leggings- no patterns or designs

Clothing should be clean, free of holes and fit correctly. Pants must fit correctly at the waist and length (sagging of pants is not acceptable). Skirts, dresses, jumpers or shorts must be longer than fingertip length when arms extended at sides. Students will go outdoors during winter months. Proper Dress (coats, hats, mittens) should be worn.

Unapproved Standardized Dress

- Any item that sends the message of gang affiliation, promotes drugs, alcohol, tobacco, profanity or other inappropriate topics
- Inappropriate make-up or writing on the body
- Sleeveless shirts, spaghetti straps, and hooded sweatshirts or sweaters
- Sweatpants and leggings
- Hooded jackets, coats, sweatshirts 7/9/2018 must be removed in the classroom
- Distracting headpieces
- Shoes that light up or blink

If students choose not to follow the Standardized Dress Code, any of the following actions may result:

Students will be asked to change into Spaght loaner standardized dress during the school day

Students will be asked to call a parent to bring their standardized dress to school

Parent conference will be held to clarify the Standardized Dress Code
