



Behavior Expectations

Conduct

Conduct which interferes with the rights of other students to learn will not be tolerated and could result in removal from summer school. Events surrounding the reason the student is sent to the office will be investigated and due process given. (No refunds)

Smoking or Use of Tobacco

The use of all tobacco products (cigarettes, cigars, pipes and smokeless tobacco) and lookalike products, such as electronic cigarettes (E-cigarettes) is prohibited in or on all school district property (BOE Policy 1150). Any violation may result in dismissal from summer school.

Dress and Courtesy

The general atmosphere of a school must be conducive to learning. If a student's general appearance attracts undue attention to the extent that it becomes a disruptive factor, the student will be asked to make necessary changes.

School ID will be required.

Cell Phones/Music Devices

Cell phone usage is prohibited during class (instructional) time. The use of music devices during class (instructional) time is at the discretion of the classroom teacher. **All USD 259 BOE Policies are in effect for summer school. USD 259 is not responsible for damaged or stolen electronic devices brought to summer school by students.**

Learning Centers

The Learning Centers will be open at all comprehensive high schools during summer school. Inquire at the individual schools for details.



Attendance Policy

Students are expected to be present each day of summer school without exception. When students are unable to be present for the entire **14** days, **students risk removal from the summer school opportunity without credit and without refund.** Family vacations, doctor appointments, and other commitments **should not** be planned during summer school classes.

No make-up sessions will be held. Three (3) tardies equal one (1) absence. Any student late after 30 minutes to a session is considered absent. Students with one or more (1) **excused** absences may be withdrawn. Students with any **unexcused** absences may be withdrawn and no refunds will be given. *Emergency absences will be up to the discretion of the summer school administrator.*

COVID-19 Precautions

Wichita Public **REQUIRES all teachers, staff, students and visitors** to wear face coverings in all WPS facilities, including during summer school. WPS students and staff will also be asked to continue frequent handwashing and sanitizing.

Enrollment Procedure

To enroll, students must see a counselor for course selection and completion of online enrollment application, <http://bit.ly/wpssummerschool>, before paying fees. Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment opens April 12, 2021. Payments for original credit classes can be made at West, Heights, Northwest, or through My Payments Plus, <https://mypaymentsplus.com>. The last day to enroll for high school summer courses is Tuesday, June 1, by 3pm.

Course Offerings

The high school summer courses allow students to receive credit in required subject areas if they have previously failed a course.

Three classes are offered for original credit based on the following criteria:

1. Government, students entering their senior year (one semester course)
2. Financial Literacy, students entering their junior or senior year (one semester course)
3. P.E. Foundations, students entering their freshman year as well as all other high school students (two semester course)

*First semester courses (.5 credit) are offered in the morning session: **7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.**

*Second semester courses (.5 credit) are offered in the afternoon session: **12 p.m. to 4 p.m.**

*The one-semester course in Government and Financial Literacy will be offered as enrollment and teacher availability allow.

*Session runs from June 3- June 24 for a total of 14 days. Summer school will not be in session on Fridays with the exception of the first Friday, June 4.

*Students attending West High summer school courses may be eligible for yellow school bus transportation. If you enroll after May 25th, there may be a delay in bus services, and you will be responsible for transportation until a bus route is assigned. Please check with West High for bus routes. Students can ride Wichita Transit free to West and Northwest summer school. Students attending West can ride Wichita Transit route 16. Students attending Northwest can ride Wichita Transit route 12. For route information, see wichitatransit.org.
