### Language Arts News (Ms. Ficken)

We have started our new curriculum and I'm very impressed with it. In this unit, students will investigate some of the challenges and triumphs of growing up, considering the possibilities good and bad that lie ahead of them. Students will read a variety of texts, watch a video, and view media as they discuss the essential question for the month. As a class, in small groups, and independently, students will work to answer this question: What are some of the challenges and triumphs of growing up? I would suggest you give your student the opportunity to continue this discussion at home. At the end of the unit, your student will pull together their learning by completing a Performance-Based Assessment answering the essential question.

# Math News (Ms. Wysong)

The focus of our upcoming math topic is fraction division. Students will review fraction and decimal comparisons and multiplying with fractions prior to working with fraction division. Students began their formal study of fractions in grade 3. They understand fractions as numbers and can reason about relative sizes of fractions. They have already learned to add, subtract, and multiply fractions.

**Talking Points:** You can support your student's learning by practicing with them. Students are learning to divide with fractions. This involves dividing whole numbers by fractions, fractions by fractions, and fractions by whole numbers.

**Some Things to Look For**: When comparing two fractions, students often assume that the fraction with the smaller denominator must be the smaller fraction. This is not always true! Remind your student to take their time as they work with fractions. Fractions can be tricky!

Don't forget to log on and practice with your Mathia workspaces. Module 1 workspaces are due October 17!

## Science News (Ms. Minko)

We are off to a great start in Science. We have gone over our policies procedures and covered all of the safety rules. We have set up our notebooks which should be in the students' binders behind the Science tab. We will be putting all of our notes and work in these and students will be using them to help them review for quizzes and tests. The metric system has been introduced and we have practiced measuring length, mass and volume using the metric system. We are moving into our first unit on Motion. The focus will be on Newton's Laws. We will be practicing our measuring skills.

## Social Studies News (Ms. Daniels)

Knowledge is Power! I hope your child loves Social Studies as much as I love teaching it!

We continue to work on continents, oceans, and other items that are marked on the WORLD map your child made. Please continue studying with your child. There will be a test before conferences in September.

In the last few weeks we started with some common vocabulary used in social studies. We also learned about prehistory or what we refer to as the period before the development of writing. In September, we will jump ahead to about 200,000 years ago when humankind began to develop and migrate as hunters and gatherers, known as the Paleolithic Era. After that we will learn about the improvements made during the Agricultural Revolution, also known as the Neolithic Era. So much good stuff!!
