#### **Lunchroom Procedures**

Our lunchroom is set up to provide a calm, structured environment where our students can eat their lunch in a 20 minute time period. Students also get a 20 minute recess period just before or after their lunchtime.

Students are asked to enter the lunchroom quietly so they can get through the lunch line quickly, hear directions, get their packages open, etc. Once all students in the grade level are seated, we allow students to talk to their elbow partner (students on either side) in a soft voice. Students are asked not to talk during the last 5 minutes of their lunch so they can focus on eating their lunch, get their things ready to go and get lined up for recess or to go back to class. We use red cups to signal "no talk" times and green cups to signal "soft talk" times.

Most of our students follow our expectations, use good manners and eat their lunch with little correction or redirection. If needed, students are given multiple reminders and opportunities to make appropriate choices in the lunchroom. Students who interfere with other's ability to eat or consistently fail to follow lunchroom procedures may be asked to move or receive other appropriate consequences. Students are never asked to throw away their lunch unless it is time for them to leave the lunchroom.

Visitors are always welcome to join us in the lunchroom. We ask that our visitors:

- Sign in through our HallPass system.
- Sit across from their child in one of the chairs provided.
- Only share/bring food for their child.
- Observe the "no talk" and "soft talk" times to help support our procedures and help maintain a calm environment for all to enjoy their lunch.
