

Drop- Off/Pick-Up Procedures

By now you are probably familiar with where to drop-off and pick-up your child, but please familiarize yourself with the following to assist with safety:

- Follow the directions of all adults/Safety Patrol.
- DO NOT get out of your car in the STOP, DROP and GO Zones on either side of the building.
- Pull into a parking place in the parking lots to drop off/pick up your children. Students should never be let out of the car/picked up in the middle of either parking lot as they our parking lots are NOT STOP, DROP and GO Zones.
- Do not CREATE Parking Spaces in unmarked areas or use Handicapped Parking without a sticker/placard.
- Only cross the street at a CROSSWALK or Corner.
- LEAVE DOGS AT HOME. Even dogs on a leash should NOT be on school grounds.
- There is NO SUPERVISION for students in the morning BEFORE 8:40 unless they are eating breakfast. Breakfast begins at 8:30.
 STUDENTS SHOULD NEVER BE DROPPED OFF BEFORE 8:40/8:30 (for breakfast).
- There is NO SUPERVISION for students in the afternoon AFTER 4:20. If students have not been picked up by 4:20, they will be brought to the office and parents will be contacted.
- If you need supervision for your child before/after times above, please contact our Latchkey Program.

Student safety is our top priority – even over your convenience. Our rules/procedures are designed to keep everyone safe and to ensure that drop-off/pick up time runs as smoothly as possible. Your cooperation is expected and appreciated! Please contact Mrs. Alexander if you have questions or concerns about our drop-off/pick-up procedures.






