

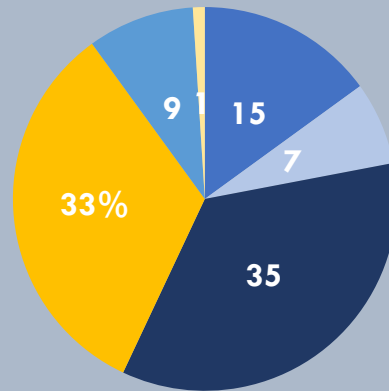
EARLY COLLEGE ACADEMY



The Early College Academy (ECA), in partnership with Friends University, is a program designed to promote access and opportunity to a college education. Early College Academy students begin college classes the summer prior to their sophomore year. By the time these students graduate from Northwest High School, they will have earned as many as 57 college credits, many of which are delivered on the Friends University Campus, and the opportunity for post-secondary scholarships that support degree completion.

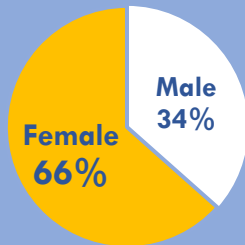

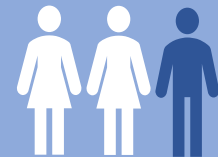
