# **Behavior Expectations**

#### Conduct

Conduct which interferes with the rights of other students to learn will not be tolerated and could result in removal from summer school. Events surrounding the reason the student is sent to the office will be investigated and due process given. All USD 259 BOE Policies are in effect for summer school.

#### **Smoking or Use of Tobacco**

The use of all tobacco products (cigarettes, cigars, pipes and smokeless tobacco) and lookalike products, such as electronic cigarettes (E-cigarettes) is prohibited in or on all school district property (BOE Policy 1150). Any violation may result in dismissal from summer school.

### **Dress and Courtesy**

The general atmosphere of a school must be conducive to learning. If a student's general appearance attracts undue attention to the extent that it becomes a disruptive factor, the student will be asked to make necessary changes.

#### **Cell Phones/Music Devices**

Cell phone usage is prohibited during class (instructional) time. The use of music devices during class (instructional) time is at the discretion of the classroom teacher. **USD 259** is not responsible for damaged or stolen electronic devices brought to summer school by students.

#### **Learning Centers**

The Learning Centers will be open at all comprehensive high schools during summer school. Inquire at the individual schools for Learning Center details.

# **Attendance Policy**

Students are expected to be present each day of summer school without exception. When students are unable to be present for the entire 12 days, students risk removal from the summer school opportunity without credit. Family vacations, doctor appointments, and other commitments should not be planned during summer school classes.

No make-up sessions will be held. Three (3) tardies equal one (1) absence. Any student late after 30 minutes to a session is considered absent. Students with one or more (1) **excused** absences may be withdrawn. Students with any **unexcused** absences will be withdrawn. Emergency absences will be up to the discretion of the summer school administrator.

## **Virtual Courses**

Education Imagine Academy (EIA) will offer Government and Financial Literacy online through Edgenuity for up to 120 participants. On Friday, May 26, 2023, students must attend a face-to-face training session from 9:00-10:00 at 412 S. Main. Students will meet in person for the proctoring of their final exam on or before Thursday, June 22, 2023. Failure to attend the final exam will result in failure of the course.

## Summer School Locations

Summer School will be held at North (8th, 9th, & 10th grade students), West (11th & 12th grade students), and EIA (Virtual Government and Financial Literacy).

- Students must enroll through their base school counselor and should contact the Summer School Contact (information listed) from your base school should you have any questions.
- Current 8<sup>th</sup> grade students wanting to take PE Foundations during summer school must enroll through their base high school. Please see contact information listed.
- Course offerings and location are contingent on enrollment. Students will be notified by Tuesday, May 30, 2023, of any changes to their summer school schedule.

## **Enrollment Procedure**

Enrollment opens Tuesday, April 11, 2023. The last day to enroll for high school summer courses is Thursday, May 25, 2023, by 3:00 PM.

To enroll, students must see a counselor for course selection and completion of enrollment form. Classes will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

## **Course Offerings**

The high school summer courses allow students to receive credit in required subject areas if they have previously failed a course.

Three classes are offered for original credit based on the following criteria:

- **1.** Government, students entering their senior year (one semester course)
- **2.** Financial Literacy, students entering their junior or senior year (one semester course)
- **3.** P.E. Foundations, students entering their freshman year or beyond (two semester course)
