2019	\$18,000	Middle School Projects	Support for the middle school level to purchase athletic uniforms and equipment at each school.
2018	\$17,500	High School Projects	Support for the high school level to purchase athletic uniforms and equipment at each school.
2017	\$18,000	Middle School Projects	Support for the middle school level to purchase athletic uniforms and equipment at each school.
2016-2017	\$21,000	High School Projects	Support for the high school level to purchase athletic uniforms and equipment at each school.
2015-2016	\$18,000	Middle School Projects	Support for middle school level to purchase athletic uniforms and equipment at each school.
2014-2015	\$21,000	High School Projects	Support for the high school level to purchase new athletic uniforms.
2013-2014	\$21,500	Middle and High School Projects	At the middle school level, \$18,000 was used to purchase uniforms and/or sweats. Each of the 18 middle school programs receive \$1,000. At the high school level, \$3,500 was used for each of the district's seven athletic trainers to have an iPad.
2012-2013	\$9,000	East, Heights, North, Northwest, South, Southeast and West	Schools used these funds to replenish training room supplies used by Certified Athletic Trainers. Trainers serve each of the 21 sports and 45 different teams at each school site. Over 4,000 students have access to and benefit from such service.
2011-2012	\$14,400	Allison, Blackbear Bosin, Brooks, Coleman, Curtis, GPA, Hadley, Hamilton, Horace Mann, Jardine, Mayberry, Marshall, Mead, PV Middle, Robinson, Stucky, Truesdell and Wilbur	24 sets (twelve boys and twelve girls) of cotton hooded sweat tops and pants for each school to support cross country and track teams.

2010-2011	\$14,000	East, Heights, North, Northwest, South, Southeast & West	Supplies for Certified Athletic Trainers serving 21 sports and 45 teams in the comprehensive high schools. Over 4,000 students benefit.
2009-2010	\$9,000	Middle School Interscholastic Track & Field Program – located at Coleman & Wilbur – used by all 18 Middle Schools	High Jump Pits, High Jump Standards and starting blocks.
2008-2009	\$14,000	East, Heights, North, Northwest, South, Southeast and West	\$2,000 to each high school to be used for uniforms, sports supplies, and sports equipment
2007-2008	\$25,500	Allison, Blackbear Bosin, Brooks, Coleman, Curtis, Hadley, Jardine, Marshall, Mayberry, Mead, PV Middle, Robinson, Stucky, Trusedell & Wilbur	High Jump Pit, Practice Hurdles, Shot puts, Basketball uniforms, Backboards, Volleyballs, Kneepads, Basketballs, Cross Country Uniforms and track uniforms.
2006-2007	\$10,500	East, Heights, North, Northwest, South, Southeast & West	Girls' basketball uniforms, soccer uniforms, wrestling singlets and head gear, boys' soccer uniforms, track and field uniforms, boys' basketball shooter shirts and warm up pants.
