New Business:

<u>IB Coordinator Report & Requests</u>: Mr. Boykins informed there are No Scholarship requests. Two faculty wish list applications were turned in:

Mrs. Archibold – Psychology – APA Teacher Affiliate Membership - \$189 for database access and membership fee. Annual Expense. We have funded for years previous.

Betsy Machain – PIB Spanish I: Two separate items – 1) 10 headphones for student use - \$12/each = \$120 and 2) Voice Amplifier, Microphone headset – allows students to hear better \$34.99.

Motion to approve Spanish Request: Flores/E. Freeman

<u>Mental Health – Mrs. Ewy</u> shared Mental Health Providers. She is the East IB Counselor in her 3rd Year at East High.

Mental Well-Being: Pandemic or not, students still experience Peer Conflict, Working Relationships, Self-Esteem, Emotions, Self-Doubt, New Relationships, Time Management, Prioritization/Acceptance, True-try, and Balance between Present & Future.

Pandemic – reduced the number of experiences leaving students to Attempt to "double-up" in activities, push harder, faster to learn more to be ready for college, Grieve, Feel isolated, compensate for "real life" experiences with "screen time" experiences, search for motivation.

Observation is Key – change in sleep, effort at home, effort at school, peer group or lack of one, eating, appearance, mood/energy level, isolation "leave me alone".

Fact: 1 in 6 children and adolescents have a treatable mental health disorder but only half receive treatment, from "Helping Kids Manage Back-to-school Stress".

Preventative mental health – early intervention is key, Primary Care Physician, Mental Health Professional referrals, Mental Health Care, and Online Therapy.

Working Relationships Matter – Am I able to be honest, feel heard, challenged, Homework, goals been established. Does my intuition feel positive about this human?

What does the school provide: School Counselor, social workers, provide band-aids of mental wellness and provide Community referrals School Psychologist – administers aptitude exams, band-aid of mental wellness and provide community referrals. Teachers: contact support staff when behaviors change in students. Security Filters. Suicide Protocol (C-SSRS-Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale). SpeakUp (www.usd259.org/speakup)

As a parent: Pay Attention, Carve out time to spend with teen, Use other trusted adults, ask teen "Do you need me to listen or offer advice?", 3 positives, 1 criticism. Gave questions to ask teens: Worries? Pressures? Expectations? What went well? Looking forward to?

- The IB Space/Room she is going into every day and she is encouraging and gaining trust of the kids to show up and ask questions. A great space for the IB students to gather. IB needs to pay attention to the Teams postings so they can know when the room is open during lunch period.

- Wednesday mornings – 3rd floor Mrs. Ewy is out there to be available to the students.

Holiday Cards/Gifts:

Holiday Gifts For Staff: Prior years we have done Nifty Nuthouse. Tanya Flores called them today – Peppermint Bark, Pretzels – cost is just over \$200. Ask for \$250 just in case. For future years- East High IBPA is what they currently have us under so can do it again next year.
