^{**}EHS/PIB: East High's courses required for underclassmen designed to prepare students for the diploma OR certificate/exam pathways.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK): 2 semesters spanning junior & senior years; required for all IB students.

CAS (Creativity, Action, & Service): CAS learning outcomes must be addressed throughout junior and senior years; 9th & 10th grade students' complete activities/assignments in preparation for junior/senior year— requires time outside of the school day to complete.

Extended Essay: maximum 4,000 words; choice of subject area & adviser; rough draft due September & final draft due December of senior year--- requires time outside of the school day to complete.

Exams: 1 SL exam is required junior year; max of 2 SL* exams junior year. 6 exams, one from each group, taken between junior & senior year.

Classes: HL = 2 years of study (SL class junior year & HL class senior year); SL = 1 year of study either junior or senior year; 2-yr $SL^* = 1$ two years of study (SL class junior year & HL class senior year), yet exam senior year is SL.

Course Offerings: SL/HL course schedule is locked in place as much as budget and demand allow to provide as much predictability as possible for each student's plan.

Each student is responsible for communicating with their parents/guardians about their 4-year plan & the choices made.

Edits to the 4-year plan require a student to submit a counselor request, if an edit is made outside of yearly grade-level edits.

Students must meet prerequisites set forth in the program of studies to enroll in a course.
