****EHS/PIB:** East High's courses *required* for underclassmen designed to prepare students for the diploma OR certificate/exam pathways.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK): 2 semesters spanning junior & senior years; required for all IB students.

Exams: 2-5 IB exams must be completed between junior and senior year. The exams can be either the SL or HL level. Recommendation: no more than 2 SL exams are taken junior year. Students can take the SL subject junior year, and the HL in the same subject senior year, yet sign up for the SL exam (known as the 2-year SL if on the diploma pathway).

IB Courses: Regardless of plans to take the IB exam, any IB course taken requires the completion of IAs, or internal assessments.

Recommendation: IB courses enrolled in result in exam sign-up and completion, as the IB exam score is what provides the possibility for college credit, not the completion of the IB course.

Course Offerings: SL/HL course schedule is locked in place as much as budget and demand allow to provide as much predictability as possible for each student's plan.

Each student is responsible for communicating with their parents/guardians about their 4-year plan & the choices made.

Edits to the 4-year plan require a student to submit a counselor request, if an edit is made outside of yearly grade-level edits.

Students must meet prerequisites set forth in the program of studies to enroll in a course.
