Treasurer's Report - Tanya Flores motion to approve, Sara Ornelas second

Current bank account - \$4,602.00

- Expenses (over the summer including August) \$2,001.00 (Senior Recognition, Scholarships for students, and Teacher Recognition)
- Income (over the summer/including August) \$2960.00
- Ended the 2021-2022 school year with a \$900 surplus (highest in past 6 years)
- Summary of spending in 2021-2022 40% teacher requests, 24% special events, 19% teacher recognition, 17% student scholarships
- Over the past 8 years, historical data show our overall contributions are less, but so are expenses

# IB Director's Report (Michael Boykins) Faculty requests -

- Ms. Beckman (PIB Spanish) REQUEST: Fluency Matters leveled readers.
  - \$9 each and she is requesting 9 for a total of \$81
  - Will be used by any student in IB Spanish particularly PIB Span 1 and 2. <u>Fluency Matters</u> caters more toward topics that are of interest to students and will contribute to a more robust vocabulary and better understanding of the Spanish language.
- Jennifer Robinson (French) REQUEST: 45 Leveled Readers (Levels 1&2)
  - \$399/unit of 45 readers
  - Will initially be used by PIB French 1&2 students and then upper levels as they progress through the program

Motion to fund both teacher requests was made by Sara Ornelas, second by Jason Smart

#### What to Expect This School Year and East IB Profile overview (Boykins)

A few facts shared by Mr. Boykins regarding the IB Learner profile of the class of 2022. (This information will be posted on the East High IB website in its entirety)

- Graduates from 2021 68 students testing with 90% received IB diploma
- Mr. Boykins received a phone call from the Director of IBO asking how we are able to maintain high diploma rates over the years. Mr. Boykins shared with him what East has done and is doing to maintain such a high level of graduates.
- 82% enrolled at an in state college
- 18% enrolled at an out of state college
- 6 National Merit finalists
- 4 National Merit commended scholars
- 10% were the 1st in family to attend college
- 39% Asian, 8% African American, 11% Latinx, 10% multi Racial, 32% white these numbers are closer to mirroring East High's overall population demographics

Explanation of certificate vs. diploma - Boykins shared the Certificate program is causing a few scheduling issues. 45 Juniors (out of 77 IB Juniors) have chosen the Certificate route
