# Speaker Presentation - Cammie Kennedy - East High College & Career Counselor (CCC) "Exploring Summer Opportunities"

- IB Summer Plan
  - o Freshman: The Build Up
    - College Visits average change of major is 5x, and change of school is 2x
    - Summer Internships (YMCA Job Prep) East High filled 60 of 200 spots. Getting a paid internship is typically difficult for HS students, but beneficial to the student being well rounded.
    - Community Service many schools give funds for community service
  - o Sophomores/Juniors
    - Summer pre-college programs
      - <u>blog.prepscholar.com/pre-college-summer-programs-for-high-school-stud</u> ents
        - A student is typically 5x more likely to be accepted in a school where they have participated in a summer program
    - **■** Continue touring schools
    - QuestBridge College Prep Scholars Program: for students who are academically outstanding and whose family income is less than \$65K.
    - **Textron** paid internship(must be at least 16 year old)
  - o Juniors College and Career Bootcamp: May 30 June 3
  - o For Everyone College and Career Fair (Open to all USD 259) Saturday, June 3rd
- Remind your child to CHECK THEIR EMAIL! A wealth of info is missed by students.
- Affirmative Action Update There is a possibility that AA will be overturned. This would affect
  many students diminishing their college enrollment possibilities. Although all colleges will be
  required to have documents stating they don't discriminate, there will be no checks and
  balances. The US Supreme Court is having the conversation at the moment potential to affect
  current Juniors and down.
- <u>FAFSA Update</u> Changing next year. From 100+ questions to 36. Changes will heavily affect our current Juniors.
- Anthony Au suggested that families make use of free classes through colleges. Cammie encourages students to engage in things that show a good work/life balance.
