Focus Talk: Asst. Principal Mr. Escarpita




Parents and guardians,

7th Grade Field Trip: Asst. Principal Mrs. Riveros



8th grade classes finished their painting and abstract art. They are now working on festive Cinco de Mayo posters


7th grade classes also have painted and made abstract art. They too are making festive Cinco de Mayo posters.


8th grade (continued)
